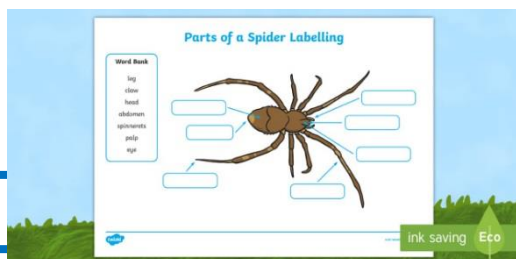


Summer 1 2019

MATHS Challenge

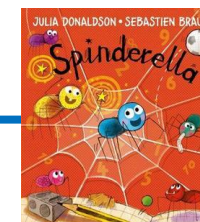
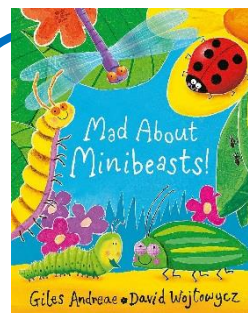
